## SAILBOATS ARE IN

Chairman Jean Eberle has logged many hours trying to decorate our town this summer with beautifully painted wood sailboats. If you haven't seen Jean, she is following up the first community art project which we did in 2006, with this new idea. We have included the information about the project in this newsletter for you to review.

There are two sizes of boats, a 6ft. by 6ft and a pint size version, 3ft. by 3ft. The boats were built by Noah Blood, a Cedar Lake resident, and are made of clear pine. They come with a wood sail or you can have a fabric sail made. The cost of the large boat is \$400.00 plus an additional \$50.00 for the wood sail. We understand it costs approximately \$60.00 for a fabric sail. The smaller boat is \$225.00 plus another \$25.00 for a wood sail. A \$200.00 deposit is required when you order the boat. The balance is due on pickup. To see the boat, stop in at the chamber office where we presently have three on display. You will begin seeing the boats around town in a matter of weeks. Jean has hers in our office and All Services Electric had theirs on display at our Gala on May 15. Holiday Liquors, Century 21 South County Real Estate, RBB Real Estate and Mid Tech Hydraulics, Yancey House of Carpets, Henn and Sons, Jerry Reiling, Lighthouse Restaurant, Ray Ferry, Christopher Burke, The Times, WPM Construction, Center Chrysler, Cedar Lake Florist and Diane Jostes have all signed on at this time and are having their boats painted as we are preparing this newsletter. And we have several other businesses waiting to get their boats.

Our last community art project was such a great success, we hope to repeat it with the sailboats. The project brought people into the community just to see how the fish were

painted. If you are interested in purchasing a sailboat contact the chamber office at 374-6157 or Jean Eberle at 374-7267. This will be a two year project and we hope to continue to add boats so they are displayed all over town.
